**Harris County Precinct 2 Welcomes New Parks Director**

Commissioner Jack Morman is proud to announce Kyle Kelley as the new Parks Director for Precinct 2. Kyle is responsible for leading day-to-day operations and maintenance of the Precinct's park system comprised of over 3,800 acres of parks and green spaces. He will evaluate the needs and interests of the community, coordinate the development of strategic park plans, and review budgets to achieve financial objectives.

Kyle lives in Atascocita with his wife, Rhonda, and their two children, Brooke and Travis. Kyle brings more than 16 years of parks and recreation experience to his new position, including 13 years in managerial roles. Most recently, he served as the Manager of Horticulture for Houston Airport Systems (HAS) where he was responsible for developing and implementing master plans for landscaping maintenance at all three Houston airports and other HAS owned properties. He also worked as the Parks Superintendent for The Woodlands Township where he oversaw the daily operations for 132 parks, 210 miles of recreational pathways, 49 ponds, 28 sports fields, and 3,800 acres of open and forested reserves. Prior to this position, Kyle served as the Lead Assistant Groundskeeper for the Houston Astros Baseball Club where he managed all indoor and outdoor stadium landscaping.

Kyle has received numerous accolades, including being named the 2013 "Parks Professional of the Year" for the Texas Recreation and Parks Society. Under his tutelage, The Woodlands Township received the 2013 "Soccer Field of the Year" award from the Texas Turfgrass Association. Kyle has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Recreation, Park, and Tourism Sciences from Texas A&M University. He is a Certified Parks and Recreation Professional, as well as a Master Certified Professional Turf Manager.
